We need to be more focused and strategic with clinical studies, favoring collaborations over endless underpowered studies that are ineffective at advancing PDT adoption. We need to blend the experience and regulatory

know-how of the developed world with the large and inexpensive patient recruitment opportunities of the developing nations. We will only be able to achieve this by being a stronger, larger and more interconnected PDT community.

Over the coming year, we will be actively looking to locate all the PDT players and bring them into the IPA platform. We are looking to collect information and stay informed about global PDT activities and know who is in the "PDT Ecosystem". Our goal is to double our membership by the Moscow World Congress in 2021.
